## What is this product?

### Type

The fund is a Finnish equity fund (UCITS) that mainly invests in shares of publicly traded small cap companies in Nordic countries, with a market capitalization of below 800 million euros.

### Term

The investment horizon is long-term and should be at least 7 years.

### Objectives

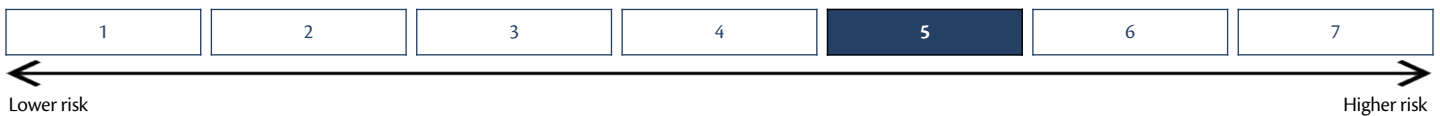
Fondita Nordic Micro Cap is an equity fund that mainly invests in shares of publicly traded small cap companies in Nordic countries with a market capitalization of less than EUR 800 million. The holdings of the fund are focused and consist of about 40 companies. The fund has a long investment horizon, given that the company's strategy and profitability progress as expected. In line with Fondita's investment philosophy, the fund invests in responsible, high quality growth micro-cap companies. It is important that the company operates in sectors with structural growth and that it has a good market position and prerequisites for continued profitable growth exist. Important quality indicators are the company's market position, return on investment, profitability, balance sheet quality, the responsibility of the company's own operations, the quality of its management and the consistency of the implementation of the business strategy. Daily trading volumes are normally lower for micro-cap companies, i.e. the liquidity is lower. In order to enable orderly portfolio management in case of larger in- or outflows, the fund also has holdings in some larger companies. This decreases the risk of higher volatility of the value of the fund due to for example sudden selling pressure due to redemptions. The fund seeks to generate over time a risk-adjusted return above the reference market through stock picking. Dividends will also be reinvested to allow compounded returns. Small caps as an asset class have historically had a track of outperforming the general market, due to their higher growth profile. However, fluctuation in the value of the fund's investments can be significant due to the higher risk, which is why the fund is recommended for investors with an investment horizon of at least 7 years. The fund's sustainability rating is Article 8 according to the EU SFDR Regulation and the investment objective is to promote environmental and social responsibility factors. In addition, the fund's target companies are required to comply with good governance practices. The Fund complies with Fondita's principles and methods for Responsible Investing.

### Intended retail investor

The investment fund is suitable for investors with a long investment horizon (at least 7 years) who want to invest in a fund that invests in shares of publicly traded small cap companies in Nordic countries. The fund is suitable for people who want to invest responsibly. The investor should have sufficient knowledge of the investment objects in the fund and be aware of the financial risk associated with the investment in question as well as equity investments in general and also be prepared to bear it.

## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

### Risk Indicator:



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for at least 7 years

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because the product developer is unable to pay you.

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-high level, and poor market conditions will likely impact our capacity to pay you.

## What happens if Fondita Fund Management Company Ltd is unable to pay out?

According to law, the fund's assets may not be stored by the fund company. Instead, each fund must have a custodian that takes care of the safekeeping of the fund's assets.

Skandinaviska Enskilda Banken AB (publ), Helsinki branch acts as custodian of the funds of the fund. In the event that the fund company goes bankrupt, the management of the fund is taken over by the custodian. The investment is not part of any investor compensation or guarantee scheme.

## What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment. If the fund is part of another product, for example a capital insurance, other costs may occur for that product.

### Costs over Time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
- 10 000 EUR is invested.

This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be 9.0 % before costs and 6.9 % after costs.

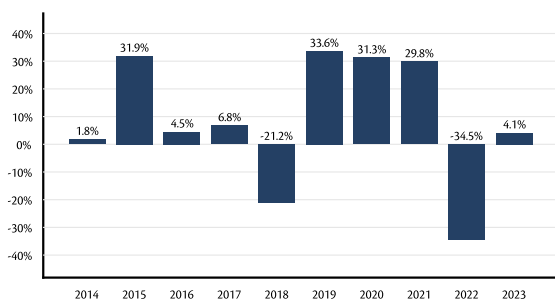
