This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

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You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type

Aegon Global Short Dated Climate Transition Fund is a sub-fund of Aegon Asset Management Investment Company (Ireland) plc.

Term

The term of the Fund is unlimited and therefore there is no maturity date. The Fund Manager / Manufacturer may decide to terminate the Fund unilaterally as set out in the Prospectus of the Funds. Situations that give rise to an automatic termination are not foreseen in the Funds Prospectus, but may be foreseen by laws and regulations applicable to the Fund.

Objective: to provide a total return (income plus capital).

Policy: invests predominantly in global investment grade (lower risk) bonds. The fund may also hold selected high yield (higher risk) bonds, contingent convertible (higher risk) bonds and cash. Bonds will be issued by companies and governments worldwide. A minimum of 80% of the Fund's net assets will be invested in investment grade bonds that have a residual maturity that does not exceed four years.

The Fund is actively managed.

The Fund may also invest in derivatives (financial contracts whose value is linked to an underlying asset).

The Fund may invest up to 20% in emerging markets. In investment terms, this means those economies that are still developing.

Within the limits set out above, the Fund has discretion in its choice of investments and is not restricted by market sector. It may also hold a limited range of other investments and it is not constrained by any benchmark or index.

The Fund may use investment techniques to manage risks and costs. These techniques include 'hedging' (using derivatives to reduce the risk associated with making investments in other currencies).

The Fund may make investments in any currency although the Investment Manager will hedge the majority of currency exposure arising from bond positions back to the Fund's Base Currency.

The Fund adheres to environmental, social and governance ('ESG') criteria for all of its bond investments (excluding collective investment schemes, index derivatives and ancillary cash) which combines screening investments along with ESG risks, performance assessment and climate related transition fundamental analysis. The Investment Manager will use its proprietary ESG framework to assign an ESG category to each bond investment ranging from 1 to 5, with 1 being the highest category and 5 the lowest. The Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in those securities with ESG categories 1, 2, or 3, with up to 10% in securities identified as ESG category 4. The Fund will not invest in securities with ESG category 5. In addition, the Investment Manager will assess climate related transition readiness and net zero alignment of issuers with a focus on supporting the energy transition by limiting exposure over time to companies which are categorized as 3- Transitioning, 4- Unprepared, or 5- Laggard. Please see the Fund's Supplement for a full description of the Investment Manager's ESG framework and criteria.

The fund promotes E/S (i.e. Environmental and Social) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation (SFDR).

Other information: You can buy, sell or exchange the Fund's shares on any business day (see 'Key Information for Buying and Selling' in the Fund Supplement to the Prospectus for more information).

Target Benchmark: The Investment Manager expects that the Fund will return performance at a rate of SARON plus 1.25% per annum, over a period of between 1 to 3 years gross of fees and expenses of the Fund. SARON, is the effective overnight interest rate paid by banks for unsecured transactions in the Swiss Franc market. Although the Fund expects to reach this level of performance, there is no guarantee that this will be achieved. The Fund's capital is at risk meaning that the Fund could suffer a decrease in value at any time

Comparator Benchmark: BofAML Global Large Cap Corporate 1-5Yr Index. Comparison against this index will allow investors to compare the Fund's performance against that of a representative but not identical universe of the Fund's potential investments. Comparison against this index will also allow investors to judge the active nature of the Fund against performance of an index which could reflect the performance of equivalent passive funds. The BofAML Global Large Cap Corporate 1-5Yr Index will be used as a reference point to compare the Fund's carbon intensity. The Fund will have at least 30% lower weighted average carbon intensity versus this comparator index

Note: the currency of this share class is different from the base currency of the Fund. We use investment techniques which aim to eliminate the impact of exchange rate changes between the share class currency and the currency of the Fund. Aegon Asset Management Investment Company (Ireland) plc operates two different methods of hedging share classes. Full details of these can be found in the Prospectus. Income the Fund receives will be reinvested and automatically reflected in the value of your shares.

Intended retail investor

The Fund will target retail and institutional investors seeking pooled exposure to the investment grade global bond market and who are comfortable with a medium level of investment risk. Share prices will fluctuate and may fall in value. It is important to understand that the Fund should be viewed as a medium to long term investment. The Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to invest in the short term.

What are the costs?

Costs over Time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario

- 10,000.00 CHF is invested.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 3 years

Investors can subscribe and redeem daily. The Company may levy an initial charge of up to 5% of the Net Asset Value per Share in connection with the subscription of Class A, D, G and X Shares of the Fund. This fee will be retained for the benefit of the Global Distributor. There can also be a Repurchase Charge of up to 3% of the redemption amount on Classes A, D, G and X Shares classes. The Fund may suffer dilution (reduction in the value of the assets as a result of the costs incurred in dealing in its underlying investments and of any spread between the buying and the selling prices of such investments which is not reflected in the issue or redemption price paid by or to Shareholders). With a view to countering this (which, if it is significant, disadvantages existing or continuing Shareholders), the Manager may make an adjustment (Dilution Adjustment) to the Share price on a daily and quarterly basis.

How can I complain?

Each shareholder/investor which is not satisfied with its experience as an investor in the Fund is entitled to bring a complaint in accordance with the applicable complaints handling policy. As an investor, you are entitled to file a complaint free of charge. Any such complaint must be handled by Aegon Investment Management B.V. or its delegates promptly and effectively. Aegon Asset Management's complaints management policy is available upon request. Irish investors may also have the right to complain to the Irish Financial Services and Pensions Ombudsman. Investors may also raise a complaint through the EU Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) portal www.ec.europa.eu/consumers/odr/ if the complaint relates to Shares that were subscribed by electronic means, including via email.
