WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

Type: GAMCO Merger Arbitrage (the "Fund") is a sub-fund of GAMCO International SICAV, an investment company organised as a société anonyme under the laws of the Grand- Duchy of Luxembourg with registered number B155657 and qualifies as a société d'investissement à capital variable (SICAV) subject to Part I of the Law of 17 December 2010 on undertakings for collective investment. The assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated from those of other sub- funds; there is no cross-liability, and a creditor of one fund has no recourse to the other sub-funds The prospectus and periodic reports are prepared for GAMCO International SICAV at umbrella level. You may switch your shares in the Fund to shares of the same class in other sub-funds in which you are eligible to invest. Further information is available from RBC Investor Services Bank S.A. (the "Administrator").

Objectives: The Fund seeks to achieve long term capital growth by engaging in risk arbitrage strategies.

Investment policy and strategy: The Fund aims to achieve this objective by investing in announced equity merger and acquisition transactions and maintaining a diversified portfolio of transactions.

The investment manager will analyze and continuously monitor a pending transaction for all elements of potential risk, including: regulatory, terms, financing, and shareholder approval. Arbitrage on mergers and acquisitions consists in investing in listed securities of companies engaged in restructuring capital transactions as leveraged buyouts, mergers, or takeover bids. The arbitrageurs seek to benefit from the decrease arising from the difference between the exchange rate of the target company and its theoretical value as a result of methods used in the restructuring operation. The Fund may also use a variety of investment strategies and instruments, including but not limited to: convertible and nonconvertible debt securities; asset-backed and mortgage-backed securities; shares or units of other investment funds or UCITS; rights qualifying as transferable securities; when issued, delayed delivery transferable securities, recently issued transferable securities; repurchase agreements, money market instruments and warrants.

The Fund may also invest in, or be exposed to, the following instruments up to the percentage of net assets indicated:

- cash and cash equivalents, including money market instruments: 20%
- special purpose acquisition companies, qualifying as transferable securities: 10%
- This Fund is actively managed. It makes reference to 13-Week Treasury Bills, for performance fee calculation only.

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Hedging: The shares are denominated in Swiss Franc (CHF) and are hedged. The base currency of the Fund is USD. The Fund will enter into currency hedging in relation to this share class which aims to protect investors from movements in the CHF exchange rate in relation to the Fund's assets denominated in currencies other than the CHF.

The Fund may use derivatives for reducing risks (hedging), as an alternative to direct investment when direct investment is not possible or for efficient portfolio management. The Fund's expected use of total return swaps ("TRS") and securities lending is expected to be 0% of net assets but may be up to 5% of net assets. Leverage will not be employed by the Fund.

This share class is a distribution share class. Income from the Fund's investments may be paid as a dividend.

You may request redemption of your shares on any day which is a full banking day in both New York City and Luxembourg City and are ordinarily processed the following business day.

Intended Retail Investors: All investors who understand the risks of the fund, plan to invest for the medium to long term, and:

- are looking for investment growth
- are interested in an investment that favours equities
- have a medium risk profile
- can bear moderate temporary losses

Term: The Fund has no maturity date. The Management Company is not entitled to terminate the Fund unilaterally nor can the Fund be automatically terminated.

COSTS OVER TIME
