What is this product?

TYPE OF PRODUCT

The product is a sub-fund of Quaero Capital Funds (Lux), an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

TERM

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However if, for any reason, the net assets of the Sub-Fund or of any Class or Sub-Class fall below the equivalent of EUR 5,000,000, or if a change in the economic or political environment of the Sub-Fund, Class or Sub-Class may have material adverse consequences on the Sub-Fund, Class or Sub-Class's investments, or if an economic rationalisation so requires, the board may decide on a compulsory redemption of all Shares outstanding in the Sub-Fund, Class or Sub-Class on the basis of the Net Asset Value per Share (after taking account of current realisation prices of the investments as well as realisation expenses), calculated as of the day the decision becomes effective.

OBJECTIVES

Objectives and investment policy

The Sub-Fund's investment objective is to provide long-term capital growth through investment in listed equities of companies in Japan.

Although there will be no formal capitalisation bias, it is envisaged that mid and small capitalisation issues will be typically well represented in the portfolio. The Sub-Fund will mainly invest in equities and equity-related securities (such as depositary receipts, closed-end real estate investment trusts (REITs)) of companies which are domiciled, headquartered or exercise the predominant part of their economic activity in Japan.

For about one third of its net assets, the Sub-Fund can:

- invest in investment grade debt securities (excepted distressed and defaulted debt securities), and
- for treasury purposes (in normal market conditions), invest in money market instruments, money market undertakings for collective investment (UCIs).

However, the Sub-Fund will not invest more than 10% of its net assets in UCIs.

In addition, the Sub-Fund can hold cash for the time necessary to proceed to re-investments, up to 20% of its net assets.

If the investment manager considers it to be in the best interests of the shareholders, the Sub-Fund may hold up to 100 % of its net assets in cash deposits, money market UCIs, money market instruments), on a temporary basis and for defensive purposes.

Derivatives The Sub-Fund is authorised to invest in financial derivative instruments, for hedging and for investment purposes.

Benchmark The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The Sub-Fund uses the index TOPIX Total Return for performance comparison only. The Sub-Fund does not track the index and can deviate significantly or entirely from the index.

Dividend Policy This Class is cumulative. Dividend distributions are not planned.

Share Class Currency The currency of the Class is CHF.

The recommended holding period of this product is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and avoiding short term market fluctuations.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (the "NAV") calculated by the Central administration. This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

INTENDED RETAIL INVESTORS

The product is intended for Institutional Investors who have entered into a specific agreement with the Company, the Investment Manager or any other entity of the Quaero Capital Group. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

Asset segregation The assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law, which means that the performance of the assets in other sub-funds does not influence the performance of your investment.

The cut-off time to submit subscription orders is 4 p.m., one business day before the relevant Valuation Day. The cut-off time to submit redemption orders is 4 p.m., one business day before the relevant Valuation Day.

Switching Shareholders may apply for any share of any sub-funds to be converted into shares of another sub-fund, provided that the conditions for accessing the target class are fulfilled with respect to the Sub-Fund, on the basis of their respective Net Asset Value calculated on the Valuation Day following receipt of the conversion request. The redemption and subscription costs connected with the conversion may be charged to the shareholder as indicated in the prospectus. What happens if FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is not making any payment to you in relation to this Sub-Fund and you would still be paid in case of a default from the Management Company.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with a separate company, the Depository, so the Sub-Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the insolvency of the Management Company. However, in the event of the Depository's insolvencies, or its delegates, the Sub-Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depository is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Sub-Fund. The Depository will also be liable to the Sub-Fund or its investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfill its obligations (subject to certain limitations).

If the Sub-Fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment.

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Depository.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does.
